RECIPE OF THE MONTH

CRABMEAT APPETIZER

8 oz. Cream cheese, softened

6 oz. Crabmeat, flaked

2 Tbsp. Finely chopped onion

1 Tbsp. Milk

1 Tbsp. Prepared horseradish

¼ tsp. salt

1/4 c. slivered almonds, toasted

1 French bread loaf, cut into 1/4 inch slices

Chopped parsley

Combine cream cheese, crabmeat, onions, milk, horseradish, and salt, mixing until well blended. Stir in almonds; spoon into 9 inch pie plate. Arrange 10 bread slices around outer edge of cream cheese mixture. Place remaining bread on un-greased cookie sheet. Bake cream cheese
