<p style="text-align: center;">CRAB BALLS</p> <p>½ c. mayonnaise 1 egg beaten ½ tsp. dry mustard 1 lb crabmeat 1c. cracker crumbs</p> <p>Mix mayonnaise, egg, dry mustard, and crabmeat and form into balls. Cream cheese 1 lb. Crabmeat 2 Tbsp Milk ½ tsp. Worcestershire sauce 1 ½ tsp. Horseradish Slivered almonds 1 Tbsp. Minced onion flakes</p> <p>Soften cream cheese to room temperature. Add milk, Worcestershire sauce, onion, and horseradish. Add crabmeat. Place in greased casserole. Sprinkle with slivered almonds. Bake 25 to 30 minutes at 350 degrees.
