SWEET POTATO BISCUITS

2 c. warm mashed potatoes

½ c. Crisco, melted

2 tsp. baking powder

3 c. sifted flour

¼ c. sugar

1 tsp. salt

Sift flour and baking powder. Mix

warm sweet potatoes with sugar,

salt, and Crisco. Add flour

mixture to sweet potato mixture

and mix thoroughly. Place on

cookie sheet by rounded

tablespoon portion. Place in

center of oven on bottom rack

and bake 12 to 15 minutes at 425°

A pan with a small amount of

water placed in oven will add

moisture and prevent biscuits

from browning too much on the

bottom.
