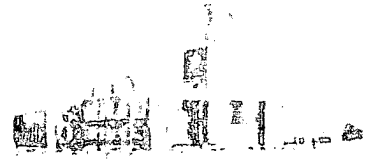

Hat’s off to Karl!

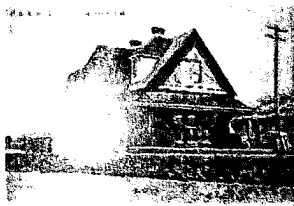

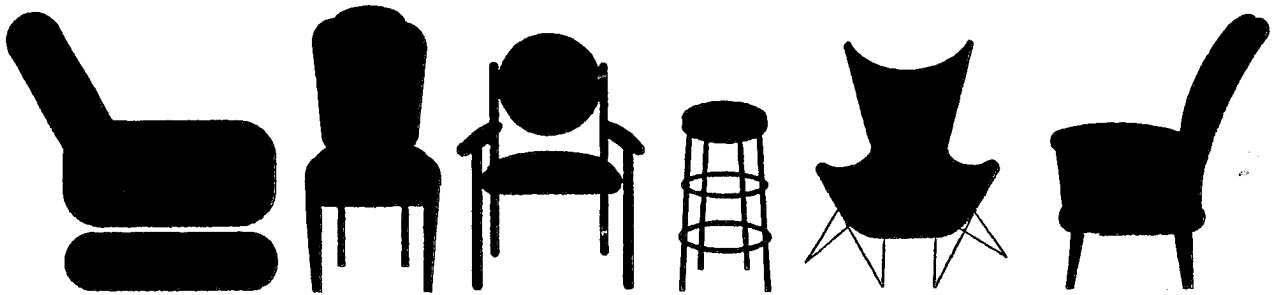
