DOES IT REALLY HAVE TO?

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Since he has been in the news recently, and could be our next U.S.A. Vice-President we have included one of Joseph R. Biden, Jr's recipe found in the 2000 edition of the Sussex County Return Day cookbook on page 41. (It is really one of Jill's favorite pasta recipes)

LEMON PASTA WITH SCALLOPS

2 c. scallops 2 Tbsp. Butter
½ tsp. red pepper flakes
1 c. pea pods ½ lb. Lemon pasta
2 tsp. finely chopped parsley
2/3 c. dry white wine ¼ c. olive oil
¼ c. freshly grated Parmesan cheese
2 tsp. finely chopped shallots
salt pepper
2 cloves garlic, chopped fine
1 tsp. fresh oregano or ½ tsp. dried oregano
1 Tbsp. Finely chopped lemon zest

In a large skillet, add the oil and butter and heat for a few seconds. Add the shallots and garlic and sauté briefly. Add the wine, oregano, red pepper flakes, and parsley. Simmer 10 minutes. Add the scallops which have been sautéed in the butter and sprinkle lightly with fresh lemon juice. Add pea pods.

Cook lemon pasta until al dente. Add the sauce and scallops to the pasta and mix a little. Add the cheese and mix well. Add Salt and Pepper to taste. Toss lightly and add 1 tablespoon finely chopped lemon zest all over.

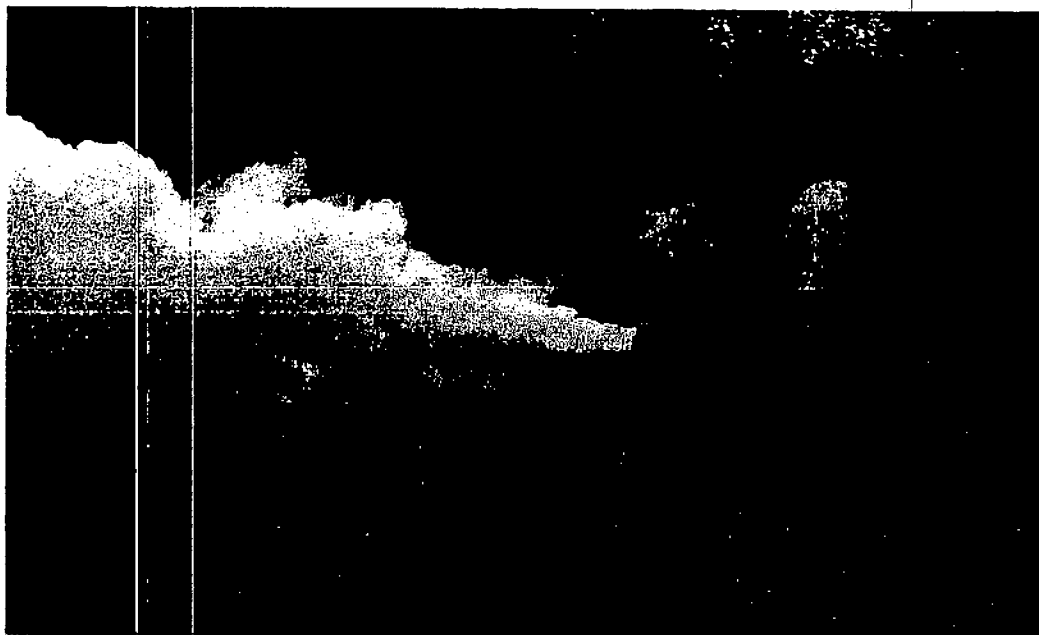
